# AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING MARIJUANA FACILITIES AND SUPPLEMENTING AND AMENDING SECTION 12 OF THE BOROUGH LAND USE ORDINANCE ENTITLED "ZONING"

#### Moved that:

- 1. Ordinance 2019-1810 entitled "An Ordinance Prohibiting Marijuana Facilities and Supplementing and Amending Section 12 of the Borough Land Use Ordinance Entitled 'Zoning'", as previously amended, is hereby further amended as follows:
  - a. "Dispensaries" is added to the title.
  - b. The exemption language to revised to make it clear that the provisions of this section shall not apply to licensed physicians writing prescriptions for medical marijuana and pharmacists filling prescriptions for medical marijuana. Language is added regulating signage at these locations.
  - c. New language is added requiring CBD retailers to provide a certificate of analysis for each CBD item sold.
- 2. The public hearing on the ordinance, as amended, will be continued until November 12.
- 3. In accordance with N.J.S.A. 40:49-2, the Clerk is directed to publish a notice of the continued public hearing on the ordinance as amended

#### BERNARDSVILLE BOROUGH ORDINANCE 2019-1810

# AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING MARIJUANA FACILITIES <u>AND DISPENSARIES</u> AND SUPPLEMENTING AND AMENDING SECTION 12 OF THE BOROUGH LAND USE ORDINANCE ENTITLED "ZONING"

WHEREAS, the "New Jersey Compassionate Use Medical Marijuana Act", N.J.S.A. 24:61-1, et seq., allows the New Jersey State Department of Health to issue permits to operate alternative treatment centers that will be allowed to perform activities necessary to provide registered qualifying patients with useable marijuana and related paraphernalia; and

WHEREAS, the governing body has determined that such proposed alternative treatment centers are not compatible with the Borough Land Development Ordinances; and

**WHEREAS**, the existing subsection 12-23.16 entitled "Uses Prohibited in All Zone Districts" needs to be reformatted;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Borough of Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that Chapter XII of the Borough Land Use Ordinance entitled "Zoning" is hereby supplemented and amended as follows:

**Section 1.** Subsection 12-23.16 entitled "Uses Prohibited in All Zone Districts" is hereby supplemented and amended to read as follows:

#### 12-23.16 Uses Prohibited in All Zone Districts.

The following uses are specifically prohibited in all zone districts of the Borough:

<u>a.</u> In all districts the <u>The</u> use of any land or property or any buildings or <u>roof</u> toprooftop structures, or the construction, development or alteration of any structure, roof, building, for the purpose of accommodating the taking off or the landing of airplanes, helicopters or any and all other types and kinds of airborne vehicles is specifically prohibited whether a principal use or an accessory use. Airborne vehicles landing in an emergency or under

emergency circumstances shall not be deemed in violation of this subsection. The landing or taking off of airborne vehicles related to a special event shall not be deemed to be a violation of this subsection provided a permit has been obtained therefor in accordance with standards established by the Governing Body. A special event shall include any event conducted, sponsored or permitted by any organization or association for recreational, entertainment, charitable, educational or benevolent purposes.

- <u>b.</u>— Drive-in, drive-through and car hop restaurants.
  - <u>c.</u> Businesses selling, distributing, cultivating, and/or growing either recreational and/or medicinal marijuana. For purposes of this ordinance, the following definitions shall apply:

(i) Cannabis or Marijuana or Marihuana: All parts of any plant of the genus Cannabis, not excepted below, and whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; and resin extracted from any part of the plant; clones of the plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of the plant, its seeds or resin including tetrahydrocannabinol; provided that cannabis shall not include:

(a) the mature stalks of the plant, fiber produced from the stalks, oil, or cake made from the seeds of the plant, any other compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of the mature stalks, fiber, oil, or cake made from the seeds of the plant or the sterilized seed of the plant that is incapable of germination;

#### (b) hemp; or

(c) the weight of any other ingredient combined with cannabis or marijuana to prepare topical or oral administrations, food, drink or other products; or

(d) Cannabidiol, commonly known as CBD, or cannabis oils.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> This paragraph in the ordinance as introduced read: "Businesses selling, distributing, cultivating, growing and/or facilitating the sale and/or use of either recreational and/or medicinal marijuana, including any ancillary or related paraphernalia."

(ii) Hemp means the plant of the genus Cannabis or any part of the plant, whether growing or not, with a delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol concentration that does not exceed 0.3% on a dry weight basis of any part of the plant of the genus Cannabis, or per volume or weight of cannabis or marijuana product, or the combined percent of delta-9-tetrahydrocannabinol and tetrahydrocannabinolic acid in any part of the plant of the genus Cannabis regardless of moisture content.

The provisions of this section shall not apply to licensed physicians writing prescriptions for medical marijuana, pharmacists filling prescriptions for medical marijuana, and accredited hospitals and teaching facilities engaged in the research or study of cannabis or marijuana and shall not apply to any person participating in clinical trials involving the use of cannabis or marijuana. Signage at these locations shall comply with all requirements of the Borough Sign Ordinance (Section 12-23.15 of this Code). Signage shall not include the marijuana leaf icon or other imagery that would detract from the professional and medical nature of the facility.

Any retailer who offers CBD (cannabidiol) products for sale must also provide a valid and accurate certificate of analysis ("COA")that shows how a product performed on test checking for CBD and THC levels, and the presence of contaminants.

- **Section 2.** Any or all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or inconsistent.
- **Section 3.** In case any article, section or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect any other article, section or provision of this ordinance except insofar as the article, section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.
- **Section 4.** This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

# ESTABLISHING FOUR-WAY STOP INTERSECTION AT BERNARDS AVENUE/GARIBALDI STREET INTERSECTION AND SUPPLEMENTING AND AMENDING CHAPTER VII OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "TRAFFIC"

**WHEREAS,** Chief of Police Kevin Valentine has recommended that the intersection of Garibaldi Street and Bernards Avenue be a four-way stop intersection to address sight clearance issues and reduce the speed of vehicles travelling on Bernards Avenue; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 39:4-197 provides that "a municipality may pass, without the approval of the Commissioner [of Transportation], and consistent with the current standards prescribed by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways, ordinances . . . [r]egulating the passage or stopping of traffic at certain congested street corners or other designated points, including the establishment of multi-way stop controls . . . "; and

WHEREAS, the governing body wishes to establish a four-way stop intersection at Bernards Avenue and Garibaldi Street as recommended by the Chief of Police;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Borough of Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, New Jersey that Chapter VII of the Borough Code entitled "Traffic" is hereby supplemented and amended as follows:

**Section 1.** §7-13 entitled "Stop Intersections" is supplemented and amended by adding the following location, making the Bernards Avenue/Garibaldi Street intersection a 4-way stop intersection:

"Pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 39:4-140, the intersections described are hereby designated as stop intersections. Stop signs shall be installed as provided.

# CONCERNING BOROUGH SHADE TREE ORDINANCE AND SUPPLEMENTING AND AMENDING CHAPTER XIII OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "TREE PROTECTION"

WHEREAS, the Borough Shade Tree Advisory Committee has recommended amending the Borough's shade tree ordinance to establish a timeframe for completing tree replacement or payment into the Tree Fund, revising the caliper of replacement trees and clarifying the language relating to replacement genus;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of
Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey, that Chapter XIII of the Borough
Code Entitled "Tree Protection" is supplemented and amended as follows:

Section 1. Subsection 13-14.1 of Section 13-14 entitled "Tree Replacement and Reforestation" is supplemented and amended to read as follows:

#### "13-14 TREE REPLACEMENT AND REFORESTATION.

#### 13-14.1 Tree Replacement.

a. The replacement of trees shall occur as prescribed in the following table:

DBH of Existing Tree Removed	Number of Replacement Trees
Less than 6 inches	1
Between 6" and 12"	2
Between 12" and 18"	4
Between 18" and 24"	5
Between 24" and 30"	7
Between 30" and 36"	10

Over 36"	The equivalent whole number of 3" caliper
	trees or greater rounded up, to equal the
	DBH of the tree removed <sup>1</sup>

Section 2. There is hereby created a new subsection 13-14.4 entitled "Time Limit for Planting Replacement Trees or Making Contribution to Tree Trust Fund," which reads as follows:

### "13-14.4. Time Limit for Planting Replacement Trees or Making Contribution to Tree Trust Fund.

- a. In the case of tree removal permits issued pursuant to section 13-7 above for trees on residential, commercial, industrial and business zone lots not involving a development application, the Applicant shall plant all replacement trees required by subsection 13-14.1 above, or make the contribution to the Tree Trust Fund permitted by paragraph "c" of subsection 13-14.1, within one calendar year from issuance of the related permit.
- b. In the case of tree removal permits issued pursuant to section 13-9 above in connection with applications to the Planning Board or Zoning Board of Adjustment (the Board") for approval of a major or minor subdivision or any site plan or any variance that requires the removal of trees, the Applicant shall plant all replacement trees required by the Board, and make any contribution to the Tree Trust Fund authorized by the Board in lieu of planting replacement trees, within the time allowed by the Board."
- Section 2. Any or all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or inconsistent.
- **Section 3.** In case any article, section or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect any other article, section or provision of this ordinance except insofar as the article, section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.
  - Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and

# CREATING AN INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY/COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE AND SUPPLEMENTING AND AMENDING CHAPTER II OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION"

**STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:** To create an Information Technology/Communications Advisory Committee to improve communications between the governing body and the residents of Bernardsville through better use of modern technology and social media

**BE IT ORDAINED,** by the Council of the Borough of Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey, that Chapter II of the Borough Code entitled "Administration" is hereby supplemented and amended as follows:

**Section 1.** There is hereby created a new section 2-47 entitled "Information Technology/Communications Advisory Committee" which reads as follows:

### "2-47 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY/COMMUNICATIONS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

#### "2-47.1 Establishment.

"There is hereby created an Information Technology/Communications Advisory Committee consisting of seven (7) members appointed by the Mayor with the consent of the Borough Council.

#### 2-47.2 Terms of Office and Vacancies.

The terms of the members first appointed under this section shall be so determined that to the greatest practicable extent the expiration of such terms shall be distributed evenly over the first three (3) years after their appointments. Thereafter, the term of each such member shall be three (3) years. If a vacancy shall occur otherwise than by expiration of the term, it shall be filled by appointment as above provided for the unexpired term.

#### 2-47.3 Organization.

In accordance with the provisions of the 'Uniform Advisory Committee Procedural Rules' set forth in section 2-46 of this Code, the Borough Council, at its annual reorganization meeting, shall appoint a chair and vice-chair who shall serve until the next Council reorganization meeting. In the case of a vacancy, the Council may appoint a chair or vice-chair to fill the unexpired term. The chair or, in his or her absence or disability, the vice-chair shall preside at all meetings of the advisory committee.

#### 2-47.3 Meetings.

Members of the Committee shall meet at least quarterly. A quorum shall consist of a majority of the full membership of the Committee. Minutes shall be kept and submitted on a quarterly basis to the Council liaison to the Committee.

#### 2-47.4 Duties.

The Information Technology/Communications Advisory Committee shall perform the following duties:

- a. Evaluate and identify means, methods and systems of electronic communications for enhancing open discussions about Borough matters and resident concerns.
- b. Recommend solutions that align with best practices for government transparency.
- c. Monitor and recommend adoption of new technologies that will enhance Borough services, and communication between the governing body and Borough residents.
- d. Formulate and recommend policies for Borough presence on social media, including but not limited to Facebook, Instagram, Twitter and Linked In.
- e. Render general advice to the Mayor and Council regarding informational technology and communications.
- f. Interact with other Boards, Commissions, Committees and citizen groups to improve Borough communications.
- g. Assist in the implementation of IT and communications programs established by the governing body.
- h. Perform such other duties as may be requested by the Mayor and Council."
- **Section 2.** Any or all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or inconsistent.
- **Section 3.** In case any article, section or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect any other article, section or

provision of this ordinance except insofar as the article, section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

# AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING VAPING IN PUBLIC PLACES AND SUPPLEMENTING AND AMENDING CHAPTER III OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "POLICE REGULATIONS"

**STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:** To prohibit vaping in municipal buildings, parks, playgrounds, recreation areas and vehicles

WHEREAS, Section 3-8 of the Borough Code presently prohibits smoking in municipal buildings, parks, playgrounds, recreation areas and vehicles; and

WHEREAS, vaping, like smoking, constitutes a health hazard so the governing body would like to also prohibit vaping in those public places;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of
Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that Chapter III of the Borough
Code Entitled "Police Regulations" is hereby supplemented and amended as follows:

Section 1. Subsection 3-8.2 entitled "Definitions" in Section 3-8, entitled "Smoking Prohibited in Municipal Buildings, Parks, Playgrounds, Recreation Areas and Vehicles," is supplemented and amended by adding the following definitions of "Electronic Smoking Device" and "Smoking":

"Electronic Smoking Device" means any product containing or delivering nicotine or any other substance intended for human consumption that can be used by a person in any manner for the purpose of inhaling vapor or aerosol from the product. The term includes any such device, whether manufactured, distributed, marketed, or sold as an e-cigarette, e-cigar, e-pipe, e-hookah, or vape pen, or under any other product name or descriptor.

"Smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, burning, or carrying any lighted or heated cigar, cigarette, pipe, hookah, or any other lighted or heated tobacco or plant product intended for inhalation, including marijuana, whether natural or synthetic, in any manner or in any form. "Smoking" includes the use of an electronic smoking device which creates an aerosol or vapor, in any manner or in any form, or the use of any oral smoking device for the purpose of circumventing the prohibition of smoking in this Article.

**Section 2.** Any or all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or inconsistent.

**Section 3.** In case any article, section or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect any other article, section or provision of this ordinance except insofar as the article, section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

**Section 4.** This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.


