### BERNARDSVILLE BOROUGH ORDINANCE #2020-1864

## REQUIRING RECORDED DEED DECLARATIONS FOR PRIVATE STORMWATER MANAGEMENT FACILITIES AND SUPPLEMENTING AND AMENDING CHAPTER 12 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "ZONING"

WHEREAS, the Borough Zoning Officer, the Borough Zoning Enforcement Officer and the Borough Engineer have recommended that the stormwater management ordinance be amended to require homeowners to deed record stormwater maintenance plans;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Borough of Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, New Jersey that Chapter 12 of the Borough Land Use Ordinance entitled "Zoning" is hereby supplemented and amended as follows:

**Section 1.** Paragraph "b" of subsection 12-29.3 entitled "Operation and Maintenance of Stormwater Management Facilities" is hereby supplemented and amended to read as follows:

"h. Private entity is required to ensure adequate long term operation as well as preventative and corrective maintenance (including replacement) on all stormwater management facilities (Best Management Practices). The Operation and Maintenance Manual for all projects shall include forms to be submitted to the Borough Engineer by April 1 of each year. These inspection and maintenance forms shall report the maintenance of the system throughout the year. The private entity shall be required to record a declaration on the deed for the property requiring present and future owners of property containing private stormwater management facilities to maintain such facilities in accordance with an Operations and Maintenance Plan and the Stormwater Management Ordinance, section 12-29.3 et seq. of the Bernardsville Land Development Ordinance<sup>1</sup>, and to file an annual report with the Borough Engineer on April 1 of each year describing maintenance activities for the previous 12 months. Neither a Certificate of Occupancy nor a Certificate of Approval shall be issued until this is finalized."

**Section 2.** Any or all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or inconsistent.

### BERNARDSVILLE BOROUGH ORDINANCE #2020- 1865

# AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$45,000 FROM THE BOROUGH OPEN SPACE TRUST FUND FOR REPAIRS AND IMPROVEMENTS TO THE MUNICIPAL POOL COMPLEX

WHEREAS, 20% of Open Space Trust Fund moneys acquired prior to 2020, and 100% of the Borough's Open Space Trust Fund moneys acquired from 2020 forward, may be used for the development of lands acquired for recreation and conservation purposes; and

WHEREAS, "development" was defined in the 2008 public question to mean:

"[A]ny improvement to a land....area of eligible Borough property that is designed to expand or enhance its utilization for outdoor recreation...purposes and shall include the construction, renovation, or repair of any such improvement. This term may include any of the following types of ancillary improvements to eligible Borough properties: roadways, parking, landscaping, fencing, lighting, utilities, structures, and any other improvement that expands or enhances the use of property for outdoor recreation...purposes"; and;

WHEREAS, the Borough Pool Complex is classified as Open Space and is eligible for said funding; and

WHEREAS, there are several repairs and improvements that are necessary to maintain the functionality and safety of the municipal pool and its facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Borough has deemed these projects to be necessary and/or valuable developments to its open space inventory,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey as follows:

- **Section 1.** Forty-Five Thousand (\$45,000) dollars is hereby appropriated from the Borough Open Space Trust fund to fund the developments described above.
- **Section 2.** Any or all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or inconsistent.
- **Section 3.** In case any article, section or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect any other article, section

or provision of this ordinance except insofar as the article, section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder of any portion thereof.

**Section 4.** This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

WHEREAS, Bernards Avenue no longer qualified as a "through street" once Ordinance #2019-1921 created a four-way stop intersection at Bernards Avenue/Garibaldi Street; and WHEREAS, the Center Street, the West Street, the Hill Street and the Maple

Street intersections with Bernards Avenue, therefore, need to be designated as stop intersections;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of

Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, New Jersey that Chapter 7 of the Borough Code entitled Traffic" is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1. §7-12 entitled "Through Streets" is amended by deleting Bernards Avenue:

Section 3. Regulatory and warning signs conforming to the current manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways shall be erected and maintained to effect the above regulation.

Section 4. Any or all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or inconsistent.

Section 5. In case any article, section or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect any other article, section or provision of this ordinance except insofar as the article, section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

### AN ORDINANCE PERMITTING "OPEN" SIGNS IN THE DOWNTOWN DISTRICT AND SUPPLEMENTING AND AMENDING ARTICLE 12 OF THE BOROUGH LAND USE REGULATIONS ENTITLED "ZONING"

WHEREAS, the governing body recently adopted Ordinance 2020-1859 entitled "An Ordinance 'Supplementing and Amending Article 12 of the Borough Land Use Ordinance entitled 'Zoning', Section 12-23.5 Signage'"; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance 2020-1859 inadvertently did not include a section permitting "open" signs in the downtown district; and

WHEREAS, the governing body wishes to correct that oversight;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Borough of Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that Article 12 of the Borough Land Use Ordinance is hereby supplemented and amended as follows:

**Section 1.** Paragraph "f" entitled "Signs in the Downtown District" of subsection 12-23.15 entitled "Signs" is hereby supplemented and amended by adding a new subpart "6" in subparagraph "(g)" entitled "Window Signs" in paragraph "2" entitled "Permitted Signs", which reads as follows:

12-23.15 Signs.

f. Signs in the Downtown District. In addition to applicable provisions in this section, signage in the Downtown District shall comply with the following:

\*\*\*\*

2. Permitted Signs. In addition to the standards in this section, the following signs and associated standards shall apply to signage in the Downtown District. Where standards below conflict with other standards in this Chapter, the standards for signs in the Downtown District shall control.

### (g) Window Signs

- (1) Window signs shall be permitted only in ground floor windows.
- (2) The content of window signs in the Downtown Districts shall be limited to the name of the entity, the date the business was established, a logo, and the street number of the premises.
- (3) Permanent signs shall be either etched or painted on the window.
- (4) Signs may not cover more than 20% of the area of the window.
- (5) In addition to the signs permitted above: restaurants may place in the window a current menu of no greater than two pages sized 8.5 inches by 14 inches; and movie theaters may place standard sized movie posters.
- (6) <u>In addition to the signs permitted above, businesses in the</u>

  <u>Downtown Districts may have one illuminated "open" sign, not to exceed</u>

  12 inches by 36 inches in area.
- **Section 2.** Any or all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or inconsistent.
- **Section 3.** In case any article, section or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect any other article, section or provision of this ordinance except insofar as the article, section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.
- **Section 4.** This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

# CREATING ONE NEW CAPTAIN POSITION AND ELIMINATING ONE LIEUTENANT POSITION IN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION"

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:14-118 provides that:

"The governing body of any municipality, by ordinance, may create and establish, as an executive and enforcement function of municipal government, a police force, whether as a department or as a division, bureau or other agency thereof, and provide for the maintenance, regulation and control thereof. Any such ordinance shall, in a manner consistent with the form of government adopted by the municipality and with general law, provide for a line of authority relating to the police function and for the adoption and promulgation by the appropriate authority of rules and regulations for the government of the force and for the discipline of its members. The ordinance may provide for the appointment of a chief of police and such members, officers and personnel as shall be deemed necessary"; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Supreme Court in Reuter v. The Borough Council of The Borough of Fort Lee, 167 N.J. 38, 41 (2001), held that the plain language of N.J.S.A. 40A:14–118 and the policies underlying it require the type and number of police positions to be created by ordinance;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Borough of Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that Chapter II of the Borough Code entitled "Administration" is hereby amended as follows:

**Section 1.** Subsection 2-24.1 "Establishment" in §2-24 entitled "Police Department" is amended to read as follows:

**2-24.1 Establishment.** There is hereby created in and for the Borough of Bernardsville a police department which shall include the following sworn officers:

One (1) Chief of Police
One (1) Captain
Two (2) One (1) Lieutenant
Six (6) Sergeants
Eleven (11) Patrol Officers

**Section 2.** Any or all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or inconsistent.

**Section 3.** In case any article, section or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect any other article, section or provision of this ordinance except insofar as the article, section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

**Section 4.** This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

### CONCERNING FIRE PREVENTION FEES AND AMENDING CHAPTER 15 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "FIRE PREVENTION"

**WHEREAS,** Fire Chief Glenn Miller has recommended that the annual registration fees for Certificates of Registration with the Fire Prevention Bureau be amended;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Borough of Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that Chapter XV of the Borough

**Section 1.** Section 15-8 entitled "Certificate of Registration; Fees" is hereby amended to read as follows:

### § 15-8 CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION; FEES.

Code entitles "Fire Prevention" be amended as follows:

a. The owners/tenants of all businesses, occupancies, buildings, structures, or premises required to be inspected under Section 15-3 and determined not to be Life Hazard Uses that are registered with the New Jersey Division of Fire Safety, shall register with the Fire Prevention Bureau upon forms provided by it for that purpose. It shall be deemed a violation of this section for an owner/tenant to fail to return such forms to the Fire Prevention Bureau within 15 days of receipt. If ownership is transferred, whether by sale, assignment, gift, intestate succession, devise, reorganization, receivership, foreclosure, execution process or any other method, the new owners/tenants shall immediately notify the Fire Prevention Bureau of the new ownership/tenancy and shall register with it.

#### Annual Registration Fee:

- 1. Business occupancies, buildings, or other structures subject to this chapter up to 2,500 500 square feet of occupiable space: \$50.
- 2. Business occupancies, buildings, or other structures subject to this chapter between 2,501 501 square feet and 5,000 1,000 square feet of occupiable space: \$75.
- Business occupancies, buildings, or other structures subject to this chapter between 5,001 1,001 square feet and 10,000 3,500 square feet of occupiable space: \$100 \$150.

- 4. Business occupancies, buildings, or other structures subject to this chapter between 10,001 3,501 square feet and 20,000 10,000 square feet of occupiable space: \$200 \$300.
- 5. Business occupancies, buildings, or other structures subject to this chapter between 20,001 10,001 square feet and 50,000 30,000 square feet of occupiable space: \$300 \$500.
- 6. Business occupancies, buildings, or other structures subject to this chapter between 50,001 over 30,001 square feet and 100,000 square feet of occupiable space: \$400 \$800.
- 7. All multiple family buildings which have interior common areas: \$100.
- 8. All Use Groups, H, F, S, and U commercial farms as defined in the New Jersey Uniform Construction Code: \$100 \$50.
- 9. All Owners of multi-tenant commercial buildings, condominiums or residential apartment complexes, where the Owner is responsible for common and assembly areas, fire alarm systems, fire protection systems, and/or alarms, elevators, mechanical and electrical equipment rooms: \$100.
- b. All Tax Exempt Properties shall be exempt from the annual registration fee but are required to submit registration forms to the Local Enforcing Agency and/or Fire Marshal within 30 days or be in violation of this chapter.
  c. The Fire Prevention Bureau shall be responsible for the collection of fees and shall remit them promptly to the Treasurer of the Borough of Bernardsville within the time period as provided by law.
- **Section 2.** In all other respects, Chapter XV of the Borough Code shall remain unchanged.
- **Section 3.** Any or all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or inconsistent.
- **Section 4.** In case any article, section or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect any other article, section or provision of this ordinance except insofar as the article, section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

# BOROUGH OF BERNARDSVILLE REMOTE WORK POLICY

The Borough of Bernardsville may allow employees to work remotely under appropriate circumstances, such as where a pandemic, natural disaster, weather related events, or medical condition or disability necessitates a temporary remote work arrangement. Employees outside of the Police Department requesting to telecommute as a reasonable accommodation or for any other reason, should contact the Borough Administrator. Police Department employees should contact the Chief of Police. Additional information relative to requesting an accommodation may be found in Section 18 Disability and Pregnancy Accommodation of the Employee Handbook.

All remote work arrangements must be approved in advance by the Borough and are subject to operational needs of the Borough and the employee's department. Accordingly, permission to work remotely is granted at the sole discretion of the Borough and may be withdrawn at any time based upon operational needs or other appropriate considerations.

Requests to work remotely should:

- be submitted in writing
- be directed to the employee's direct supervisor with a copy to the Department Head or Chief of Police and Borough Administrator
- outline the reason for the request and the anticipated duration and schedule (e.g., full time, certain days, etc.)<sup>i</sup>

Employees granted permission to work remotely are expected to fulfill all essential functions of their role and work effectively and efficiently. As needed and appropriate, employees otherwise working remotely will be required to be on-site as operational needs demand.

Employees permitted to work remotely must continue to abide by all Borough policies contained in the Employee Handbook or elsewhere, including but not limited to the Equal Employment Opportunity/Anti-Discrimination, Anti-Harassment, Sexual Harassment, Whistleblower, Employee Complaint and the Communication Media/Social Media Policies. Police Department employees will be required to follow all applicable policies, procedures, special orders, etc. applicable to their employment in the Police Department.

Nonexempt employees who are permitted to work remotely must comply with Borough timekeeping and payroll practices and <u>must accurately record all working time</u>.

Employees working remotely must be responsive to internal and external requests and communications and must be available by phone and email during normal business hours in order to address issues as they arise in the same fashion they would if they were working in Borough Hall or other Borough offices or facilities.

Unless otherwise required by law by way of a reasonable accommodation, employees working remotely will provide all furniture and equipment needed to work remotely and the Borough will not be responsible for any damage to the employee's furniture or equipment due to the remote work arrangement.

Remote access to the Borough network and computer systems may be monitored consistent with Borough Policy relative to its IT systems.

This policy and any approved remote work at home policy are subject to change at the sole discretion of the Borough.

# DEMANDING THAT THE NEW JERSEY STATE LEGISLATURE ACCEPT ITS RESPONSIBILITY TO ADMINISTER THE PROVISIONS OF THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING ACT AND STAY FURTHER ACTION UNTIL SUCH TIMES AS IT HAS PROMULGATED RULES GOVERNING ITS IMPLEMENTATION

WHEREAS, in 1975 the New Jersey Supreme Court in Mount Laurel I decreed that every municipality in New Jersey, "must, by its land use regulations, presumptively make realistically possible an appropriate variety and choice of housing. More specifically, presumptively it cannot foreclose the opportunity of the classes of people mentioned for low and moderate income housing and in its regulations must affirmatively afford that opportunity, at least to the extent of the municipality's fair share of the present and prospective regional need therefor" (10 S. Burlington Cty. N.A.A.C.P. v. Mount Laurel Twp., 67 N.J. 151, 174 (1975)); and

**WHEREAS,** in 1983, the Supreme Court in Mount Laurel II expanded the Mount Laurel doctrine, saying:

"Therefore, proof of a municipality's bona fide attempt to provide a realistic opportunity to construct its fair share of lower income housing shall no longer suffice. Satisfaction of the Mount Laurel obligation shall be determined solely on an objective basis: if the municipality has in fact provided a realistic opportunity for the construction of its fair share of low and moderate income housing, it has met the Mount Laurel obligation to satisfy the constitutional requirement; if it has not, then it has failed to satisfy it. Further, whether the opportunity is "realistic" will depend on whether there is in fact a likelihood-to the extent economic conditions allow-that the lower income housing will actually be constructed. Plaintiff's case will ordinarily include proof of the municipality's fair share of the regional need and defendant's proof of its satisfaction. Good or bad faith, at least on this issue, will be irrelevant." (S. Burlington Cty. N.A.A.C.P. v. Mount Laurel Twp., 92 N.J. 158, 220–22 (1983)); and

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court in Mount Laurel II suggested that builders' remedies should be used to force compliance by municipalities, reasoning that:

Experience . . . has demonstrated to us that builder's remedies must be made more readily available to achieve compliance with Mount Laurel. We hold that where a developer succeeds in Mount Laurel litigation and proposes a project providing a substantial amount of lower income housing, a builder's remedy should be granted unless the municipality establishes that because of environmental or other substantial planning concerns, the plaintiff's proposed project is clearly contrary to sound land use planning. We emphasize that the builder's remedy should not be denied solely because the municipality prefers some other location for lower income housing, even if it is in fact a better site. (S. Burlington Cty. N.A.A.C.P. v. Mount Laurel Twp., 92 N.J. 158, 279–80 (1983)); and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Legislature responded quickly to the Court's Mount Laurel decision by enacting the Fair Housing Act of 1985, N.J.S.A. 52:27D-301, et seq., which created the Council on Affordable Housing ("COAH") which as the Court noted in Mount Laurel IV "... was designed to provide an optional administrative alternative to litigating constitutional compliance through civil exclusionary zoning actions." (*In re Adoption of N.J.A.C. 5:96 & 5:97 ex rel. New Jersey Council on Affordable Hous.*, 221 N.J. 1, 4 (2015); and

WHEREAS, COAH, pursuant to the authority granted to it by the Fair Housing Act, then adopted procedural and substantive rules which provided clear guidance to municipalities as to how they could meet their affordable housing obligation; and

WHEREAS, in its rules, COAH assigned a fair share number to each municipality and set forth various mechanisms that a municipality could use in order to satisfy that obligation; and

WHEREAS, Bernardsville Borough, like many other municipalities throughout the State of New Jersey, met its First and Second Round Affordable Housing Obligations through the COAH process; and

WHEREAS, COAH adopted the First Round Rules for the period from 1987 through 1993 and the Second Round Rules for the period 1993 to 1999 and then extended to 2004; and

**WHEREAS,** COAH was obliged by the Fair Housing Act to adopt Third Round Rules to take effect in 2004, however, but never adopted rules that were acceptable to the Courts; and

**WHEREAS,** in 2015, the Supreme Court again stepped in, finding that COAH's failure to adopt Third Round Rules forced the Court to intervene; and

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court designated Mount Laurel judges in each of the fifteen court vicinages to hear all Mount Laurel cases; and

WHEREAS, instead of providing clear guidance, like the COAH rules did, the Supreme Court in Mount Laurel IV set forth vague standards that have led to a complex system of non-uniform implementation; and

WHEREAS, as a result of the Supreme Court's decision in Mount Laurel IV, municipalities no longer were assigned fair share numbers, no longer had clear and concise procedural and substantive rules to follow, and no longer had one tribunal to decide these issues, which meant that even the threshold issues of regional need and local fair share obligations had to be litigated before fifteen different Mount Laurel judges, and as a result, municipalities were forced to spend tens of thousands, and in some cases hundreds of thousands of dollars, to negotiate fair share numbers with the Fair Share Housing Center ("FSHC")and to gain court approval of settlement agreements negotiated with FSHC; and

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court in Mount Laurel IV concluded its opinion by encouraging the Legislature to once again assume responsibility in the area of affordable housing, saying:

"In conclusion, we note again that the action taken herein does not prevent either COAH or the Legislature from taking steps to restore a viable administrative remedy that towns can use in satisfaction of their constitutional obligation. In enacting the FHA, the Legislature clearly signaled, and we recognized, that an administrative remedy that culminates in voluntary municipal compliance with constitutional affordable housing obligations is preferred to litigation that results in compelled rezoning. (Citation omitted.) It is our hope that an administrative remedy will again become an option for those proactive municipalities that wish to use such means to obtain a determination of their housing obligations and the manner in which those obligations can be satisfied" (*In re Adoption of N.J.A.C.* 5:96 & 5:97 ex rel. New Jersey Council on Affordable Hous., 221 N.J. 1, 34 (2015)); and

WHEREAS, it has been five years since the Mount Laurel IV opinion was issued and, to the detriment of each municipality in New Jersey and to the future viability of the State, neither the Legislature nor the Governor nor COAH have taken any action to remedy the situation; and

**WHEREAS,** if the Governor, the Legislature and COAH continue to ignore their responsibilities, municipalities will once again face a burdensome, time-consuming and expensive process to obtain Fourth Round Mount Laurel compliance starting in 2025;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey, that it does hereby demand that the Governor and the Legislature cease their unconscionable disregard of this most important provision of the State constitution and take immediate and decisive action to restore a viable administrative remedy that municipalities can use in satisfaction of their constitutional obligations to provide affordable housing.
