BERNARDSVILLE BOROUGH ORDINANCE 2020-1831

AN ORDINANCE REZONING LOTS 21 AND 22 IN BLOCK 111, LOTS 11 AND 11.01 IN BLOCK 112, LOTS 13, 14 AND 15 IN BLOCK 113 AND LOTS 1.01, 15, 15.01 AND 16 IN BLOCK 114 FROM R-4 TO R-5 AND AMENDING ARTICLE XII ENTITLED "ZONING" OF THE BOROUGH LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE

WHEREAS, the owners of property located at 42 Maple Street and known as Block 113, Lot 15 on the Borough Tax Maps have requested that their property be rezoned from R-4 to R-5; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council forwarded this request to the Planning Board for review and recommendation; and

WHEREAS, Borough Planner John P. Szabo, Jr., P.P., AICP, in a December 11, 2019 memorandum to the Planning Board recommended that the property owners' request be granted and further that the "remainder 2 lots between Maple Street and Garibaldi Street" and the "properties along the northerly frontage of Pine Street" also be rezoned to "promote better consistency"; and

WHEREAS, Frank Mottola, the Administrative Officer of the Planning Board, in a December 13, 2019 email, informed the Borough Clerk that "After thorough study and consideration, the [Planning Board] voted to endorse the . . . recommendations by its Planner, John Szabo, regarding the requested zone line modification"; and

WHEREAS, the governing body agrees with the recommendations of the Borough Planner as endorsed by the Planning Board;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that Article XII of the Borough Land Development Code be supplemented and amended as follows:

Section 1. Subsection 12-2.2 entitled "Zoning Map," as previously amended, is further supplemented and amended by adding the following new subparagraph 10 to paragraph "a" entitled "Zoning Map Amendments":

"10. The Map is amended to change the designation of Lots 21 and 22 in Block 111, Lots 11 and 11.01 in Block 112, Lots 13, 14 and 15 in Block 113 and Lots 1.01, 15, 15.01 and 16¹ in Block 114 from R-4 Residence district to R-5 Residence district."

Section 2. Any or all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with

any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or

inconsistent.

Section 3. In case any article, section or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect any other article, section or provision of this ordinance except insofar as the article, section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

Section 5. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

ORDINANCE #2020-1834 CALENDAR YEAR 2020 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget up to 2.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and,

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Bernardsville in the County of Somerset finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2020 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Bernardsville hereby determines at that 3.5% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$106,064.20 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council of the Borough of Bernardsville hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of Bernardsville, in the County of Somerset, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2020 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Bernardsville shall, in accordance with this ordinance and N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.14, be increased to 3.5%, amounting to \$371,224.90, and that the CY 2020 municipal budget for the Borough of Bernardsville be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

BOND ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$1,000,000, AND **AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$952,000 BONDS OR** NOTES BOROUGH, FOR VARIOUS OF THE **IMPROVEMENTS OR PURPOSES AUTHORIZED TO BE** UNDERTAKEN BY THE BOROUGH OF BERNARDSVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, **NEW JERSEY.**

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BERNARDSVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the Borough of Bernardsville, New Jersey. For the said several improvements or purposes stated in said Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriations made for said improvements or purposes, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and amounting in the aggregate to \$1,000,000 including the aggregate sum of \$48,000 as the several down payments for said improvements or purposes required by law and more particularly described in said Section 3 and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvements or purposes and to meet the part of said \$1,000,000 appropriations not provided for by application hereunder of said down payments, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$952,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable notes of the Borough in a principal amount not exceeding \$952,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued, the appropriation made for and estimated cost of each such purpose, and the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each such purpose, are respectively as follows:

The excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over

the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the

amount of the said down payment for said purpose.

Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The said purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and each is a property or improvement which the Borough may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The average period of usefulness of said purposes within the limitations of said Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the respective amounts of the said obligations authorized for the several purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is sixteen (16) years.

(c) The supplemental debt statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in said Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$952,000, and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

(d) Amounts not exceeding \$100,000 in the aggregate for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs and other items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 40A:2-20 of said Local Bond Law may be included as part of the costs of said improvements and are included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

Section 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer, provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. §40A:2-8. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the dates of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, interest rate and maturities of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 6. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 7. The capital budget or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any

inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Borough Clerk and are available for public inspection.

Section 8. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BERNARDSVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), **AS FOLLOWS**:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the Borough of Bernardsville, New Jersey. For the said several improvements or purposes stated in said Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriations made for said improvements or purposes, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and amounting in the aggregate to \$961,000 including the aggregate sum of \$46,000 as the several down payments for said improvements or purposes required by law and more particularly described in said Section 3 and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvements or purposes and to meet the part of said \$961,000 appropriations not provided for by application hereunder of said down payments, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$915,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable notes of the Borough in a principal amount not exceeding \$915,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued, the appropriation made for and estimated cost of each such purpose, and the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each such purpose, are respectively as follows:

BOND ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$200,000, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$190,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH, FOR VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS OR PURPOSES AUTHORIZED TO BE UNDERTAKEN BY THE BOROUGH OF BERNARDSVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BERNARDSVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), **AS FOLLOWS**:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the Borough of Bernardsville, New Jersey. For the said several improvements or purposes stated in said Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriations made for said improvements or purposes, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and amounting in the aggregate to \$200,000 including the aggregate sum of \$10,000 as the several down payments for said improvements or purposes required by law and more particularly described in said Section 3 and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

WHEREAS, the Borough wishes to acquire these services via non-fair and open processes pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.5; and

WHEREAS, Topology has completed and submitted a Business Entity Disclosure Certification which certifies that the business entity has not made any reportable contributions to a political or candidate committee in the Borough of Bernardsville in the previous one year, and that the contract will prohibit the contractor named herein from making any reportable contributions through the term of the contract.

WHEREAS, contracts for professional services may be awarded without public bidding pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(1)(a)(I); and

WHEREAS, the Chief Financial Officer has certified in writing to the Board the availability of adequate funds to pay the maximum amount of these contracts;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Borough of Bernardsville, in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey, as follows:

The Borough of Bernardsville does hereby authorize a professional services contract with Topology NJ LLC to prepare the redevelopment plan in accordance with its January 14, 2020 proposal for the property located at 65 Morristown Road and known as Block 125, Lot 13 on the Borough Tax Maps for the lump sum total of \$6,500, plus reimbursable costs not to exceed \$1,000 without prior approval.

The Borough of Bernardsville does hereby authorize a professional services contract with Topology NJ LLC to provide supportive services to the Downtown Redevelopment Committee in accordance with its January 22, 2020 proposal at the blended rate of \$150/hour not to exceed \$5,000 without prior written approval plus reimbursable costs not to exceed \$1,000 without prior approval.
- 3. The Mayor and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized to enter into professional services contracts with Topology NJ LLC in form acceptable to the Borough Attorney.
- 4. The Business Disclosure Entity Certification and the Determination of Value shall be placed on file with this resolution, and that notice of these awards be advertised one in the Bernardsville News.
- 5. The Borough Clerk in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:11-5(1)(a)(I), is directed to publish a notice once in the official newspaper stating the nature, duration, service and amount of these contracts.
- 6. The Borough Clerk shall make copies of this resolution available for public inspection at the Borough Hall, 166 Mine Brook Road, Bernardsville, New Jersey, during regular business hours.
- 7. These contracts shall be charged to budget line item(s) _____. The certification of available funds by the Financial Officer shall be attached to the original of this resolution and shall be maintained in the files of the Borough Clerk.
