ORDINANCE #2022-1932

BOND ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING \$1,300,000, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,235,000 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH OF BERNARDSVILLE FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF VARIOUS ROADS AUTHORIZED TO BE UNDERTAKEN IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF BERNARDSVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH
OF BERNARDSVILLE, IN THE COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY (not less than
two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized as general improvements to be made or acquired by the Borough of Bernardsville, New Jersey. For the said several improvements or purposes stated in said Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriations made for said improvements or purposes, said sum being inclusive of all appropriations heretofore made therefor and amounting in the aggregate to \$1,300,000 including the aggregate sum of \$65,000 as the several down payments for said improvements or purposes required by law and more particularly described in said Section 3 and now available therefor by virtue of provision in a previously adopted budget or budgets of the Borough for down payment or for capital improvement purposes.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvements or purposes and to meet the part of said \$1,300,000 appropriations not provided for by application hereunder of said down payments, negotiable bonds of the Borough are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,235,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey. In anticipation

of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improvements or purposes, negotiable notes of the Borough in a principal amount not exceeding \$1,235,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued, the appropriation made for and estimated cost of each such purpose, and the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each such purpose, are respectively as follows:

IMPROVEMENT OR PURPOSE

- (a) Improvement of various streets in and by the Borough by the construction or reconstruction therein of roadway pavements at least equal in useful life or durability to a roadway pavement of Class B construction (as such term is used or referred to in Section 40A:2-22 of said Local Bond Law), including without limitation, Mine Avenue, lower Garibaldi Street, lower Maple Street, Grove Street, West Street and Boylan Terrace, together with all sidewalks, curbs, retaining walls, structures, appurtenances, engineering, surveys, equipment, work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and hereby approved
- (b) Improvement of the storm water drainage system in and by the Borough by the reconstruction of drainage facilities in and along various roads in the Borough, including without limitation, Mine Avenue, lower Garibaldi Street, lower Maple Street, Grove Street, West Street and Boylan Terrace, together with all structures, road resurfacing, site work, equipment, work and materials necessary therefor or incidental thereto, all as shown on and in accordance with the plans and specifications therefor on file or to be filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and hereby approved

The excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the said down payment for said purpose.

- Section 4. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The said purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses and each is a property or improvement which the Borough may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness of said purposes within the limitations of said Local Bond Law and taking into consideration the respective amounts of the said obligations authorized for the several purposes, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the said bonds authorized by this bond ordinance, is 16.19 years.
- (c) The supplemental debt statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Borough Clerk and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in said Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided for in this bond ordinance by \$1,235,000, and the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.
- (d) Amounts not exceeding \$130,000 in the aggregate for interest on said obligations, costs of issuing said obligations, engineering costs and other items of expense listed in and permitted under Section 40A:2-20 of said Local Bond Law may be included as part of the costs of said improvements and are included in the foregoing estimate thereof.

Section 5. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer, provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the Chief Financial Officer. The Chief Financial Officer shall determine all matters in connection with the notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the Chief Financial Officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. §40A:2-8. The Chief Financial Officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the dates of delivery thereof. The Chief Financial Officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body of the Borough at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the principal amount, interest rate and maturities of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 6. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 7. The capital budget or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any

inconsistency herewith and the resolutions promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing all detail of the amended capital budget or temporary capital budget and capital program as approved by the Director, Division of Local Government Services, are on file with the Borough Clerk and are available for public inspection.

Section 8. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

BERNARDSVILLE BOROUGH ORDINANCE #2022-1934

REVISING THE TYPE AND NUMBER OF POSITIONS IN THE BERNARDSVILE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND AMENDING CHAPTER 2 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "ADMINISTRATION"

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:14-118 provides that:

"The governing body of any municipality, by ordinance, may create and establish, as an executive and enforcement function of municipal government, a police force. . . . The ordinance may provide for the appointment of a chief of police and such members, officers and personnel as shall be deemed necessary;" and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Supreme Court in Reuter v. The Borough Council of The Borough of Fort Lee, 167 N.J. 38, 41 (2001), held that the plain language of N.J.S.A. 40A:14–118 and the policies underlying it require the type and number of police positions to be created by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police and the Public Safety Committee have recommended that the Police Department be reorganized as set forth below;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that Chapter II of the Borough Code entitled "Administration" is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1. Subsection 2-24.1 "Establishment" in §2-24 entitled "Police Department" is amended to read as follows:

2-24.1 Establishment. There is hereby created in and for the Borough of Bernardsville a police department which shall include the following sworn officers:

One (1) Chief of Police One (1) Captain <u>Two (2) One (1)</u> Lieutenants <u>Five (5) Six (6)</u> Sergeants Eleven (11) Patrol Officers

Section 2. Any or all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with

any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or inconsistent.

Section 3. In case any article, section or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect any other article, section or provision of this ordinance except insofar as the article, section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

ALLOWING THE BOROUGH PUBLIC WORKS COMMITTEE TO GRANT EXCEPTIONS TO THE FIVE-YEAR MORATORIUM ON ISSUANCE OF ROAD OPENING PERMITS FOR NEWLY-PAVED STREETS AND AMENDING SECTION 14-1 OF THE BOROUGH CODE ENTITLED "MAINTENANCE AND USE OF SIDEWALKS AND STREETS"

WHEREAS, subsection 14-4.6 of the Borough Code entitled "Moratorium" provides that:

"§ 14-4.6 Moratorium.

"There shall be a five-year moratorium on the issuance of road opening permits for newly paved streets. Exceptions shall be granted for utility emergencies or road openings that impact the safety and welfare of property owners (e.g., electric service to new home). Any emergency work or undue hardship shall be approved by the Borough Council.

WHEREAS, the governing body has determined that the Borough Public Works

Committee is best qualified to decide whether an exception to the moratorium should be granted under the terms of the ordinance;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Borough of Bernardsville in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey that Section 14-1 of the Borough Code entitled "Maintenance and Use of Sidewalks and Streets" is hereby amended as follows:

Section 1. Subsection 14-4.6 entitled "Moratorium" is hereby amended to read as follows:

"§ 14-4.6 Moratorium.

"There shall be a five-year moratorium on the issuance of road opening permits for newly paved streets. Exceptions shall be granted for utility emergencies or road openings that impact the safety and welfare of property owners (e.g., electric service to new home). Any emergency work or undue hardship shall be approved by the Borough Council Borough Public Works Committee....."

Section 2. Any or all other ordinances or parts thereof in conflict or inconsistent with any of the terms hereof are hereby repealed to such extent as they are so in conflict or inconsistent.

Section 3. In case any article, section or provision of this ordinance shall be held invalid in any court of competent jurisdiction, the same shall not affect any other article, section or provision of this ordinance except insofar as the article, section or provision so declared invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

Section 4. This ordinance shall become effective immediately upon final passage and publication as required by law.

BOROUGH OF BERNARDSVILLE RESOLUTION #22-193

AUTHORIZING SUBLEASE OF THE BERNARDSVILLE RAILROAD STATION

WHEREAS, the governing body at its September 12, 2022 meeting adopted Resolution 22-177 authorizing a new lease with New Jersey Transit Corporation ("NJ Transit") for the Bernardsville Train Station subject to certain conditions; and

WHEREAS, the proposed new lease is for a term of five years with an option for the Borough to extend the lease for an additional four-year term; and

WHEREAS, Article 23 of the NJ Transit lease allows the Borough to sublet the station with NJ Transit's consent, which shall not be unreasonably withheld, subject to a number of terms and conditions, including, but not limited to, the following:

- The Borough must notify NJ Transit in writing of the name and address of the proposed sublessee and provide any financial information which NJ Transit may reasonably require to determine the net worth of such sublessee.
- The Borough shall remain liable for the observance of all its covenants and obligations under the lease.
- The Borough must comply with N.J.S.A. 40A:12-24 regarding the rental of space not needed for public use.
- The sublease agreement may allocate responsibility for the repair, operation and maintenance of any subleased space; however, the Borough shall remain ultimately responsible to NJ Transit for the repair, operation and maintenance of the subleased premises.
- The sublease agreement shall contain the required clauses set forth in Exhibit "C" of the underlying lease with NJ Transit.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-24 provides that:

"Every . . . municipality may lease for fixed and upon prescribed terms and for private purposes any land or building or any part thereof not presently needed for public use to the person who will pay the highest rent therefor . . . "; and

WHEREAS, in anticipation of entering into a new extended lease with NJ Transit, the Borough issued a request for proposals on or about October 6, 2021 seeking a sublessee to operate a restaurant at the Bernardsville Train Station; and

WHEREAS, the Borough received two proposals in response to its RFP; and WHEREAS, after considering those proposals, the governing body determined that the proposal submitted by Pizzeria TÀTON By MV to operate a pizza restaurant utilizing an authentic volcanic clay oven to create Neapolitan pizzas is most advantageous to the Borough and its residents inasmuch as it will be an attractive restaurant business occupying the historic Bernardsville Train Station and as such will contribute to the redevelopment of the downtown; and

WHEREAS, Pizzeria TÀTON By MV has asked for a rent concession of seven months of lease payments to cover the large scale renovations that will be needed; and

WHEREAS, Pizzeria TÀTON By MV has also asked the Borough to apply to the Director of the Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control for a special concessionaire permit pursuant to the provisions of N.J.A.C. 132-5.2, which will allow it to sell alcoholic beverages for consumption in the Railroad Station building; and

WHEREAS, this approval of the sublease agreement with Pizzeria TÀTON By MV is subject to the approval of NJ Transit in accordance with the terms of the underlying lease agreement between the Borough and NJ Transit; and

WHEREAS, this approval of the sublease agreement with Pizzeria TÀTON By MV is also subject to the Borough's being able to negotiate a new underlying lease with NJ Transit especially with respect to responsibility for major repairs;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the governing body of the Borough of

Bernardsville, in the County of Somerset, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The Mayor and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to execute a

sublease agreement with Pizzeria TATON By MV in a form acceptable to the Borough

Attorney.

2. The term of the sublease shall be concurrent with that of the underlying lease between

the Borough and NJ Transit, that is for a term of five years with one four-year renewal

option.

3. The sublease agreement may include a seven month rent concession as requested by IL

FORNO Pizzeria by MV.

4. The rents during years one and two of the sublease agreement shall be \$1,500 a month

commencing in the eighth month and ending in the twenty-fourth month.

5. In accordance with IL FORNO Pizzeria by MV's proposal, the monthly rents for years

three through nine shall be as follows:

Years three and four: \$2,000

Year five: \$3,000 Year six: \$3,500

Year seven: \$4,000

Years eight and nine: \$4,500

6.Pizzeria TÀTON By MV shall post a security deposit of \$3,000 (two months' rent)

upon execution of the sublease agreement. The amount of the security deposit will be

increased whenever the rent is increased so that the Borough is always holding two

months' rent security deposit during the term of the sublease.

7. Pizzeria TÀTON By MV shall renovate the train station building in accordance with its

proposal at the approximate cost of \$650,000.

8. The effectiveness of this resolution is contingent upon the Borough's receiving NJ Transit's approval of the proposed sublease as required by the underlying lease.

- 9. This resolution is also contingent upon the Borough's negotiating a lease with NJ Transit which makes NJ Transit responsible for major repairs to the premises.
- 10. The form of the sublease agreement shall be subject to the approval of the Borough Attorney.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOROUGH OF BERNARDSVILLE, COUNTY OF SOMERSET, NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE AMENDMENT OF THE REDEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT WITH AR AT QUIMBY, LLC REMOVING ALL REFERENCES TO EMINENT DOMAIN AND RESTATING AND RECONFIRMING THE PRIOR DESIGNATION AS A NON CONDEMNATION AREA IN NEED OF REDEVELOPMENT (QUIMBY LANE)

WHEREAS, the Borough of Bernardsville, in the County of Somerset, New Jersey (the "**Borough**"), a public body corporate and politic of the State of New Jersey (the "**State**"), is authorized pursuant to the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, *N.J.S.A.* 40A:12A-1 *et seq.* (the "**Redevelopment Law**"), to determine whether certain parcels of land within the borough constitute an area in need of rehabilitation and/or an area in need of redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Borough Council adopted a Resolution on October 15, 2019 (Resolution #19-203) authorizing the Planning Board of the Borough of Bernardsville (the "Planning Board") to conduct an investigation to determine if certain property located at 65 Morristown Road, which property is identified as Block 70, Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 6.01, 6.02, 6.03, 6.04, 6.05, 6.06, 6.07, and 6.08; Block 71, Lots 4, 5, 5.01, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13; Block 98, Lot 1; Block 124, Lot 1; and Block 144, Lot 1, as shown on the official Tax Map of the Borough (the "Redevelopment Area"), constitutes a non-condemnation "area in need of redevelopment," in accordance with the Redevelopment Law; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council on January 13, 2020 adopted a Resolution accepting the Planning Board's recommendation that the area was found to meet the necessary statutory criteria, and designated the entire Study Area as a *Non-Condemnation Area in Need of Redevelopment*; and

WHEREAS, on August 9, 2021 the Borough Council by resolution designated **ADVANCE REALTY INVESTORS** as redeveloper of a portion of the Redevelopment Area under the Redevelopment Plan (the "**Redeveloper**"); and

WHEREAS, on January 12, 2022 the Borough and the Redeveloper entered into a redevelopment agreement with the Redeveloper providing for the development of the Property in accordance with the Redevelopment Plan (the "**Redevelopment Agreement**"),

WHEREAS, the Borough reconfirms and restates that the Redevelopment Area is and remains a *Non-Condemnation Area in Need of Redevelopment* wherein the Borough did not retain the power to use eminent domain; and

WHEREAS, the Borough desires to amend the redevelopment agreement (the "Amended Agreement") to reconfirm that the Borough does not have the power under the Redevelopment Law to condemn any of the properties within the Redevelopment Area.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF BERNARDSVILLE, NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** The Borough Council, confirms the designation of **AR AT QUIMBY, LLC** as the Redeveloper of Block 70, Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 6.01, 6.02, 6.03, 6.04, 6.05, 6.06, 6.07, and 6.08; Block 71, Lots 4, 5, 5.01, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13, in the Borough of Bernardsville as provided for and in accordance with the provisions of the New Jersey Local Redevelopment and Housing Law.
- **Section 2.** The Borough Council of the Borough of Bernardsville hereby authorizes the execution of an "Amended Redevelopment Agreement By and Between the Borough of Bernardsville and **AR AT QUIMBY, LLC**, concerning the Redevelopment Area identified as 70, Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 6.01, 6.02, 6.03, 6.04, 6.05, 6.06, 6.07, and 6.08; Block 71, Lots 4, 5, 5.01, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13, in the Borough of Bernardsville, in such a form deemed advisable by the Borough Attorney or Redevelopment Counsel, subject to further approval by the Borough Council.
