OPEN SESSION:

OUESTIONS FOR THE RECREATION DIRECTOR/CORRESPONDENCE:

Andrew Taylor asked if we can send out surveys for winter programs to the parents and the coaches. Steve Reynolds has requested to consider allowing non-residents to participate in our travel basketball teams for those who attend the Somerset Hills School District. Cheryl Ferrante will be contacting Jack Pidgeon.

Cheryl Ferrante reported on the Directors Report about recreation programs and the pool.

Recreation

- Chair and basic yoga are ongoing at the Bernardsville Library.
- Recreation has received numerous compliments from parents on the new K-2nd recreation basketball program.
- The Intergenerational Pizza Bingo will be held on February 19th at the Wellness Center.
- The Shawnee Mountain Ski Trip began on January 6th. There are 51 7th & 8th graders registered for the program.
- The wrestling program has 28 K-2nd, 18 2nd- 5th and 20 5th- 8th graders. The program will end in February.
- After school enrichment programs will begin in February.
- Program proposals have been sent to vendors for the 2020 Summer Camps. Vendors must submit the completed program proposal by January 31st.

Pool

- Bonding at the pool needs minor repairs. Recreation needs to wait until the spring when the covers are off of the pools to have the electrician to do a complete check for the certification.
- Recreation is receiving quotes on pool painting.
- Repairs to the baby pool will cost \$5,000.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Andrew Taylor reported on the financial report that the pool revenue was down \$7,600 and recreation revenue \$2300 from 2018. Out of the 253 Resident Family Memberships, 211 families took advantage of the early registration fee. Revenue is up \$13,000 from 2018. The turf field rentals have brought in \$8,400 in 2019. Net expenses are down \$2600 from 2018. The minimum wage increase has affected salaries along with new pool regulations that required more lifeguards to be on duty.
